Future Now: The Aesthetica Art Prize Symposium

Meet Over 40 High Profile Speakers from the UK's Leading Art Organisations

Aesthetica presents <u>Future Now</u> from 26 - 27 May at York St John University, providing a brand new opportunity for artists and the public at large to connect with key industry figures from leading art organisations, publications and galleries, broadening their knowledge of contemporary art and enhancing their career by gaining essential industry insight and advice.

To date, the **Aesthetica Art Prize**, **now in its ninth year**, has supported a wealth of established and emerging artists, many of whom have progressed their careers and furthered their engagement within the art world since their exposure through the Prize. These include Chileanborn photographer Carolina Redondo, later selected for *In Search of the Miraculous* at Newlyn Art Gallery & The Exchange; and French photographer Noémie Goudal, who has had solo shows at FOAM in Amsterdam and The Photographers' Gallery in London.

Dr Fiona Thompson, Dean of Arts, York St John University, comments: "We are really delighted to host this important Symposium at York St John as part of our continuing engagement with Aesthetica. Together we bring the world to York reflecting this City as a global player, as designated by its status as a UNESCO City of Media Arts. Through the Symposium we look at plotting the future directions of travel for current and future makers of art – the line-up of speakers plus the diversity of delegates ensure this will be an exciting and dynamic event."

Tackling themes in today's artistic climate through **lectures**, **portfolio reviews** and **panel discussions**, the *Future Now* symposium focuses on the arts ecosystem within a broader social context. The symposium is a place for an **exchange of ideas**, **offering support**, **talent development** and **networking opportunities**.

The event also welcomes Aesthetica Art Prize 2016 Shortlisted artist Andrea Luka Zimmerman, Lecturer at Central St Martins and nominee for the Jarman Award and winner of the Artangel Open Award, who speaks in conversation with Maggie Ellis, Head of Artists' Moving Image at Film London, about the evolution that is occurring in artists' film as it defies categorisation through adaptation of more cinematic practices.

Working at the intersection of public and private memory, Zimmerman uses fiction and documentary devices to challenge official histories, marginalisation and political, social and economic violence. Her film *Estate, a Reverie* (2015) is currently on show at the Aesthetica Art Prize Exhibition, York St Mary's.

Cherie Federico, Aesthetica Art Prize Director, comments: "We are really excited about the number of high-profile speakers from leading art and cultural organisations that are involved in the Symposium. There has been great interest in this event as a place to explore the current state of play in the art world, and look towards the future of visual culture. There is a dynamic mix of talks and panel discussions, and many opportunities for artists to network with their peers and industry professionals. It is a great event for anyone working in the sector, or interested in learning more about it."

Adding to the dynamic programme of talks, panel discussions and portfolio reviews, where artists can get feedback and advice on their work to support future development, there are also **film screenings** showing works selected for the Aesthetica Art Prize in a cinema context, as well as a compilation of outstanding experimental films from the BAFTA Qualifying Aesthetica Short Film Festival (ASFF), an annual event that takes place this year from 3-6 November in York.

Visitors can book onto four sessions per day, with either a One-Day Pass or a Two-Day Pass. Booking is essential, and early booking is recommended due to limited capacity.
