Aesthetica Art Prize Winners Announced 2017

The winners were announced for the Main Prize and the Emerging Prize at last night's Private View and Prize Giving Ceremony at the Aesthetica Art Prize Exhibition within York Art Gallery.

Adam Basanta was awarded the Main Art Prize of £5,000, courtesy of Hiscox, for his piece *Curtain (white)* 2016 a sound installation considers the ubiquitous white earbud headphone, an everyday device that creates an interior environment in which one can retreat from the external world. Within this personalised bubble, the headphones function as a visual "do not disturb" sign.

Curtain (white) plays on this by producing a three-metre-long "curtain" which sections the space, both visually and sonically. Patterns of white noise sweep across the installation, which, despite being synthetically produced, resemble waves, wind, rain and insects. Curtain (white) was made possible through support from the Canada Council for the Arts and The Agosto Foundation.

Maryam Tafakory received the Emerging Art Prize of £1,000, courtesy of Hiscox. Partmoving image, part-performance, Maryam Tafakory's *Absent Wound* draws on self-censorship, womanhood and rites of passage, interweaving poetry and rituals whilst combining a minimalist syntax and figurative mode of representation.

In *Absent Wound*, a "Zoorkhaneh" ("house of strength") presents the contrasts between two opposites. The physical strength and expectations of wrestling are brought into proximity with a female protagonist who faces emergent womanhood at the advent of her menstrual cycle. The contradictory interrelationship between the social and textual disturbs stereotypes and gender-specific roles.

Cherie Federico, Director of the Aesthetica Art Prize, says: "It is with great pleasure that we showcase the 16 shortlisted artists at York Art Gallery. This year's exhibition brings together an inspiring collection of innovative projects by some of today's leading artists, and we are delighted to showcase these works to audiences and hope that they will find them inspiring and insightful."

The winners were chosen by a panel of judges comprising industry experts from across the creative sector.
