## **Call for Entries: Aesthetica Creative Writing Award 2018**

The renowned international literary prize, **Aesthetica Creative Writing Award 2018 is now open for entries**. Recognising the excellence in contemporary writing and celebrating new work, the competition, now in its 12<sup>th</sup> year, presents an opportunity for both emerging and established writers and poets to showcase their talent.

Attracting thousands of entries from across the world each year, the prize offers talented practitioners an opportunity to further their literary career. Open to writers working at all levels, the award has two categories for entry: Poetry and Short Fiction. There are no limitations on themes or subject matters, only encouragement to submit work that harnesses the boundless potential of language, offering limitless and unforgettable worlds.

Overall, **60 finalists will be chosen by the judging panel** to feature in the *Aesthetica Creative Writing Annual,* creating an outstanding collection of new writing, with two winners being chosen from each category of Poetry and Short Fiction. As well as publication, winners are awarded £1,000 prize money each; a one year subscription to *Granta;* a selection of books from Vintage and Bloodaxe Books; full membership to The Poetry Society (Poetry Winner), and consultation with Redhammer Management (Short Fiction Winner).

**The Award is judged by a panel of literary experts**, passionate about new and inspiring works that demonstrate creativity, including; Arifa Akbar, journalist, critic and former Literary Editor of *The Independent*, and Professor at Leeds Trinity University and Poet Dr Oz Hardwick, who has been published extensively worldwide and shortlisted for Best Spoken Word Performer.

The Short Fiction category is also judged by a Reading Panel, including: **Katy Guest**, Reviewer and Editor of *Unbound*; **Martine Peirguin**, Creative Writing and Film, Media and Contemporary Cultures tutor at the University of Edinburgh; **Stephen Toase**, North Yorkshire based author; **Liz Jones**, Teaching Fellow at Aberystwyth University; **Rebekah Lattin-Rawstrone**, Author and Lecturer at City University; **Teresa Palmiero**, Editoral Manager at *Wasafiri*; and **Tom Vowler**, Editor of *Short Fiction* journal and Associate Lecturer at Plymouth University.

**Cherie Federico, Director and Editor of Aesthetica, says:** "The intention of the Creative Writing Award is to encourage new writing talent, bringing work from practitioners working at all levels to a wider audience, demonstrating the true innovation of language and ideas. The award is a celebration of contemporary writing, reflective of different cultures, landscapes and stories waiting to be told. I cannot wait to see what this year's selection brings."

The Aesthetica Creative Writing Award is **open for entries until 31 August 2018**. Poetry submissions should be no more than 40 lines and Short Fiction entries should be no more than 2,000 words. All work submitted must be written in the English language.
