POETRY & SHORT FICTION WINNERS ANNOUNCED FOR 2019

The winners of the renowned Aesthetica Creative Writing Award have been announced for 2019, celebrating excellence in contemporary writing.

The Aesthetica Creative Writing Award is a hotbed for new talent across Poetry and Short Fiction, now in its 14th year. Organised by the art and culture publication, *Aesthetica Magazine*, it presents both emerging and established writers with an opportunity to showcase new work and propel their careers through publication and talent development. Passionate about supporting creative voices, the Award welcomed thousands of entries from over 40 countries worldwide, with the Jury remarking on the outstanding selection of works presented in this year's competition.

The Poetry Award was presented to Audrey Molloy, for her entry *On Reaching 45 the Poet Realises She Is Only* 23. Based in Sydney, Australia, her work has been widely published most recently in *The Moth, The Irish Times* and *Mslexia*, and earlier this year she received the Hennessy Award for Emerging Poetry 2019.

Sean Gregory was announced as the winner of the Short Fiction Award for his entry *Louish & Benim.* Based in West Yorkshire, he is primarily a musician and award-winning theatre maker, having recently been the recipient of a Peggy Ramsay Bursary.

Both winners received £1,000 prize money, alongside further prizes from Creative Writing sponsors, which include consultations with literary agents **Redhammer Management**, Membership to **The Poetry Society**, subscriptions courtesy of **Granta**, and handpicked book selections from both **VINTAGE** and **Bloodaxe Books**.

Winners are published within the *Creative Writing Anthology*, an inspiring collection of narrative and poetic forms. The publication provides a platform for writing across a range of themes, topics and styles, offering meaningful perspectives on the world around us. It experiments with form and technique to express the complex emotions of desire, grief, conflict and resolution, as well as concepts of transformation, perception and change.

Featuring over 50 works, the Anthology also includes works from shortlisted writers; **Melissa Studdard**, whose writings have appears in *The Guardian* and *The New York Times*; recent winner of the Ruskin Prize and third in the National Poetry Competition **Mark Fiddes**; **Claire Potter** author of three poetry collections (*Swallow, In Front of a Comma, N'ombre*) and shortlisted writer for the Keats-Shelley Poetry Award 2017; poet and visual artist **Ella**

Frears whose work has been published in *Poetry London, LRB, The Moth* and has completed residencies for the National Trust and Tate Britain.
